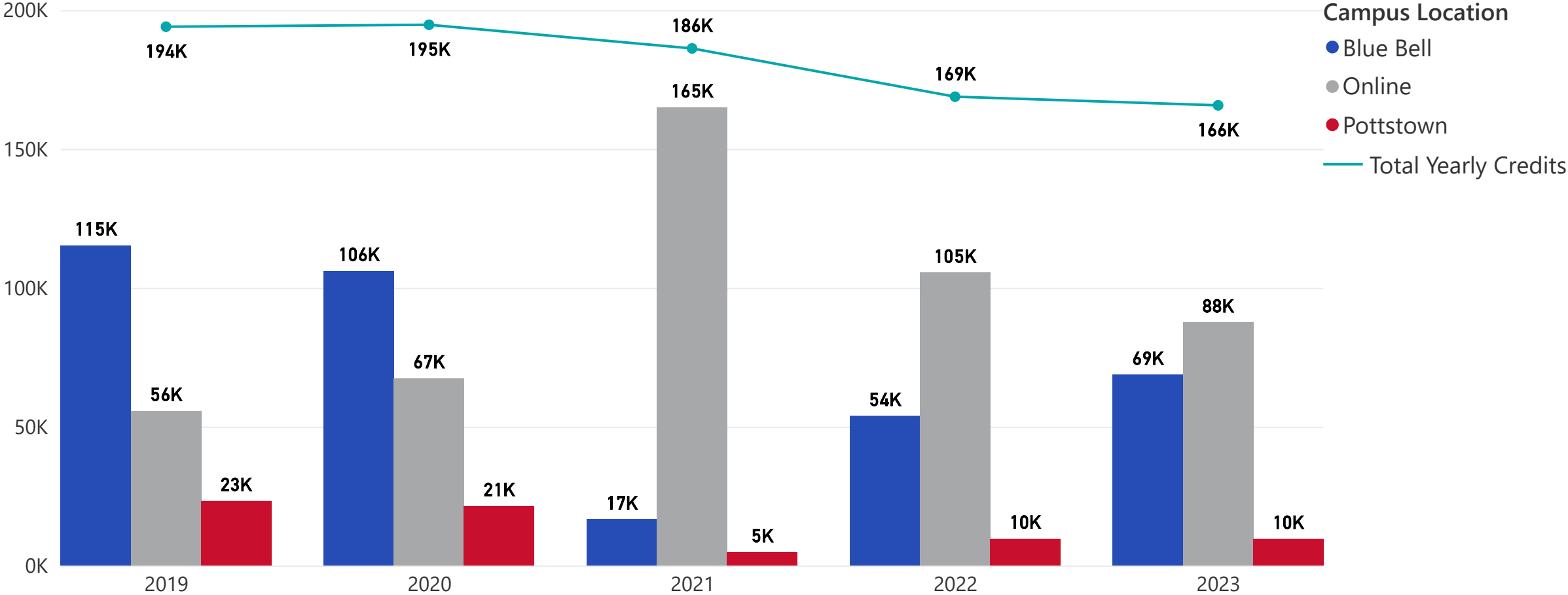
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## Enrollment Trends

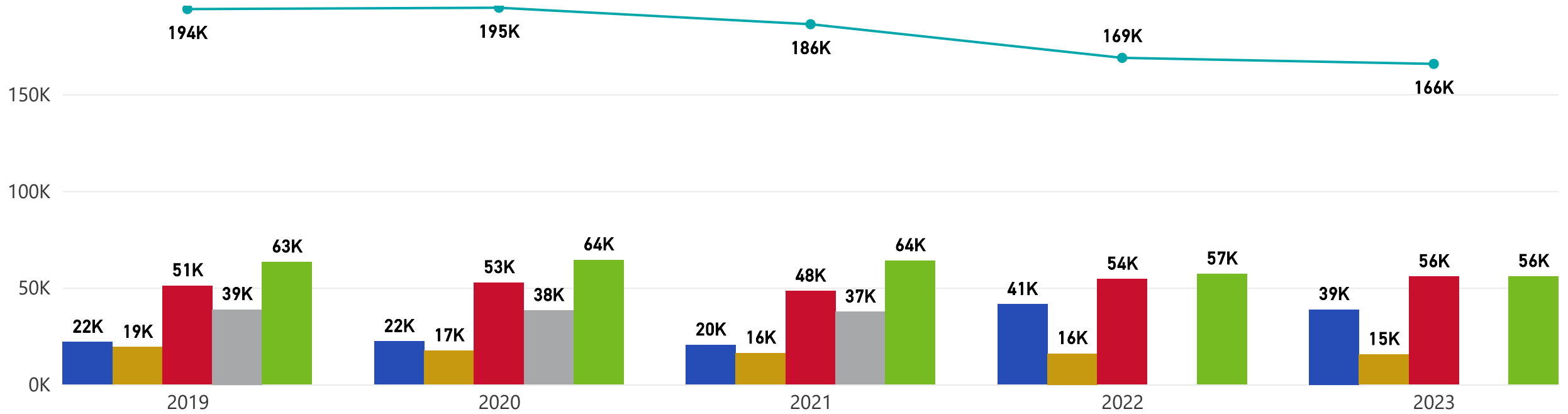
Data on enrollment trends are an important indicator for overall institutional health in higher education. Enrollment numbers have been fluctuating due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and other factors such as demographic changes and institutional competition. This is especially true of those areas, such as the northeast corridor of the United States, which has been historically saturated with public and private educational institutions. Future data will assist the College in understanding post-pandemic enrollment.

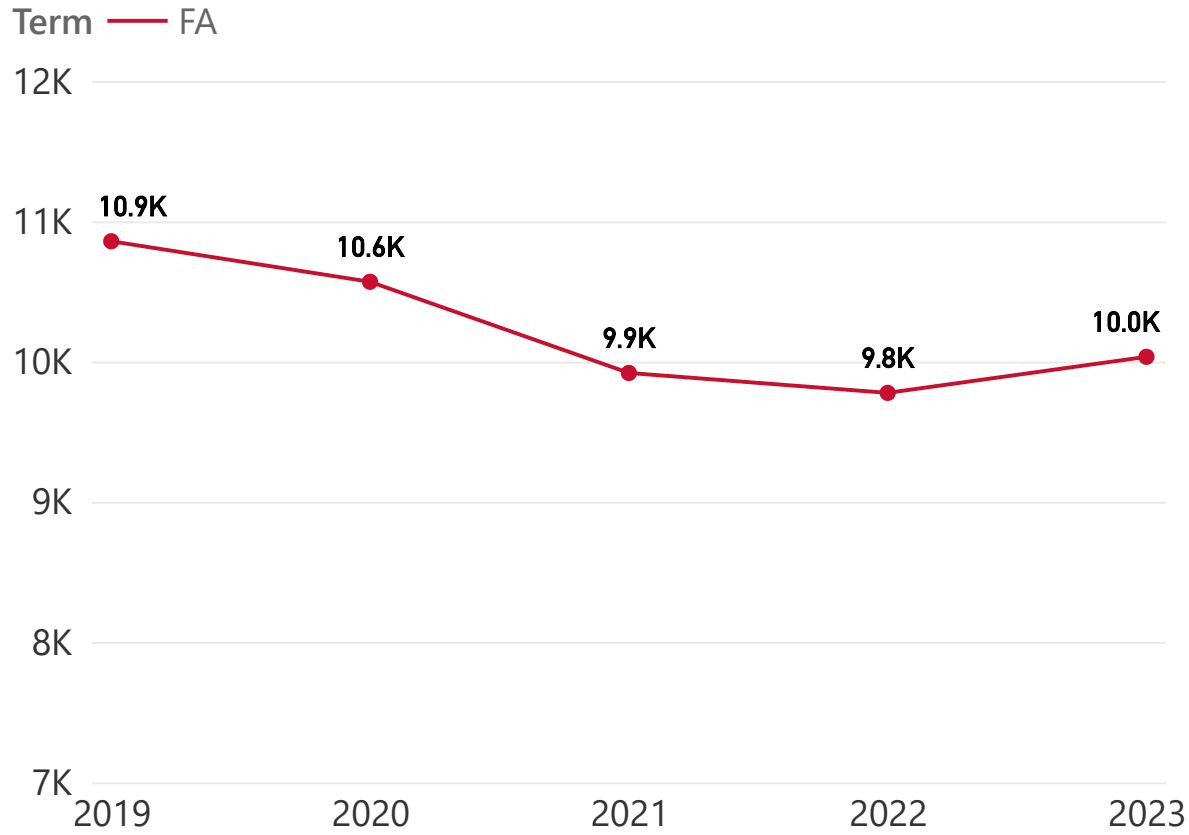

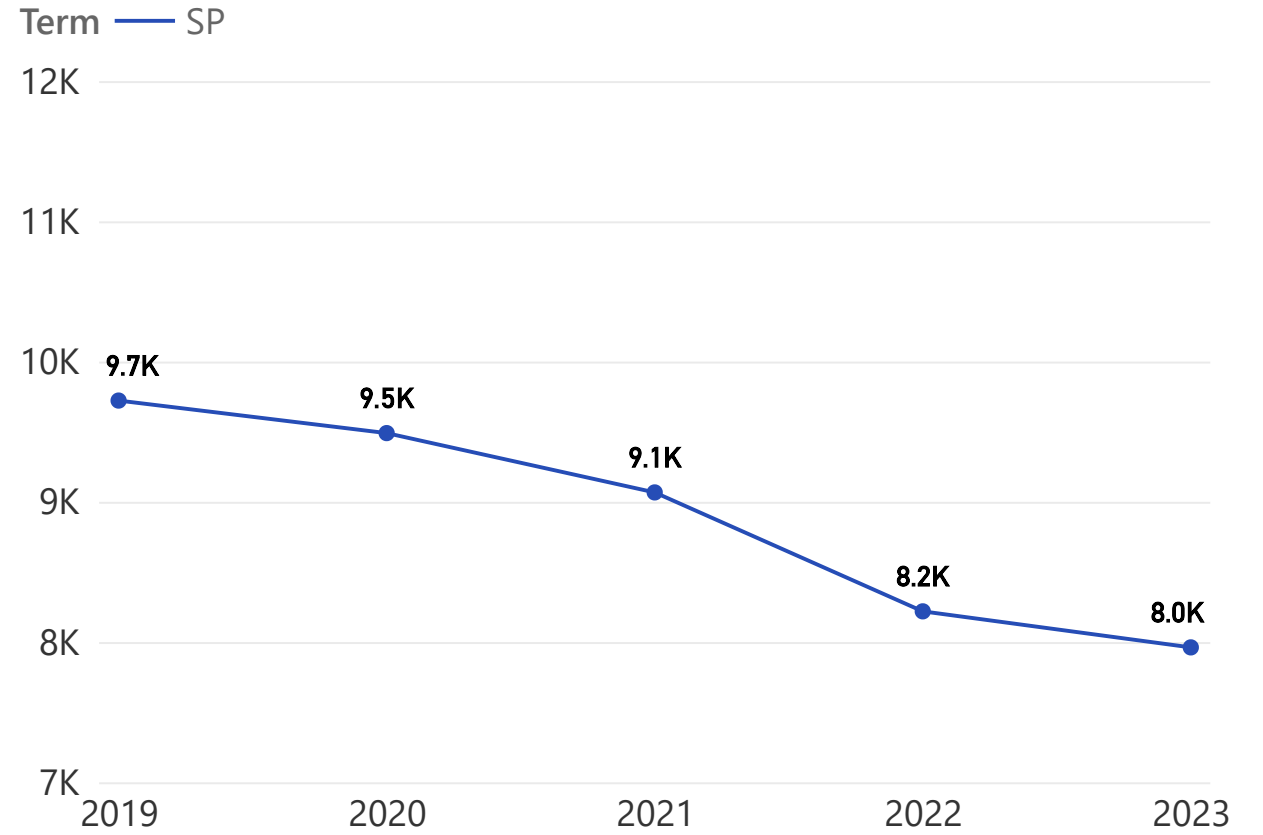

### Unduplicated Headcount by Spring Term

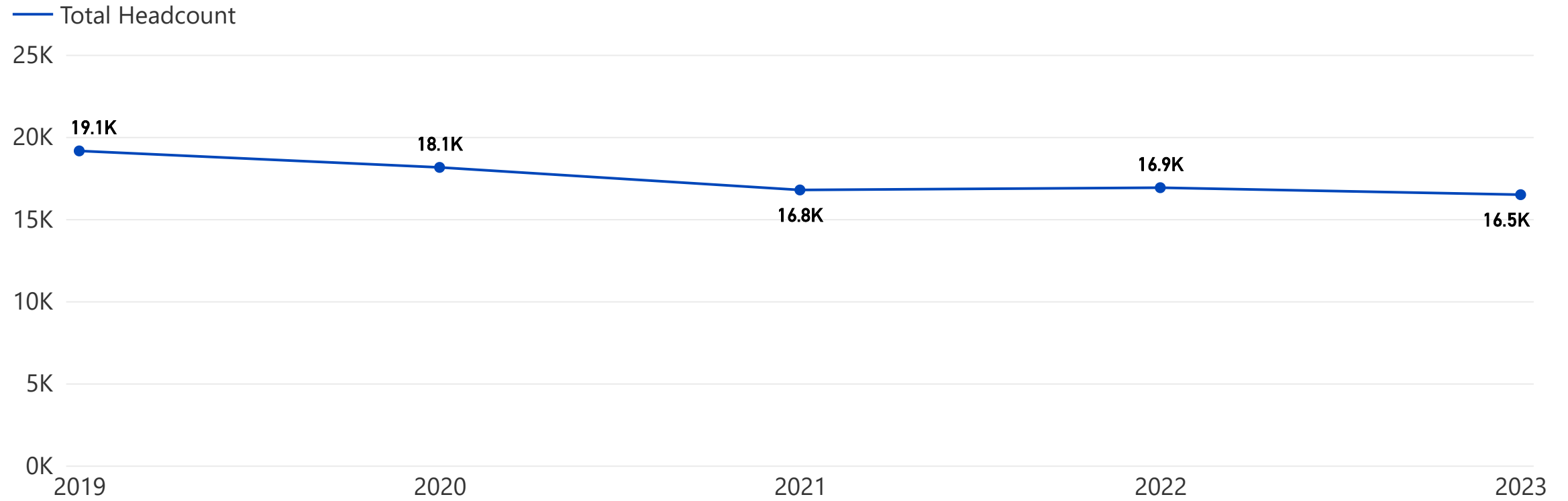

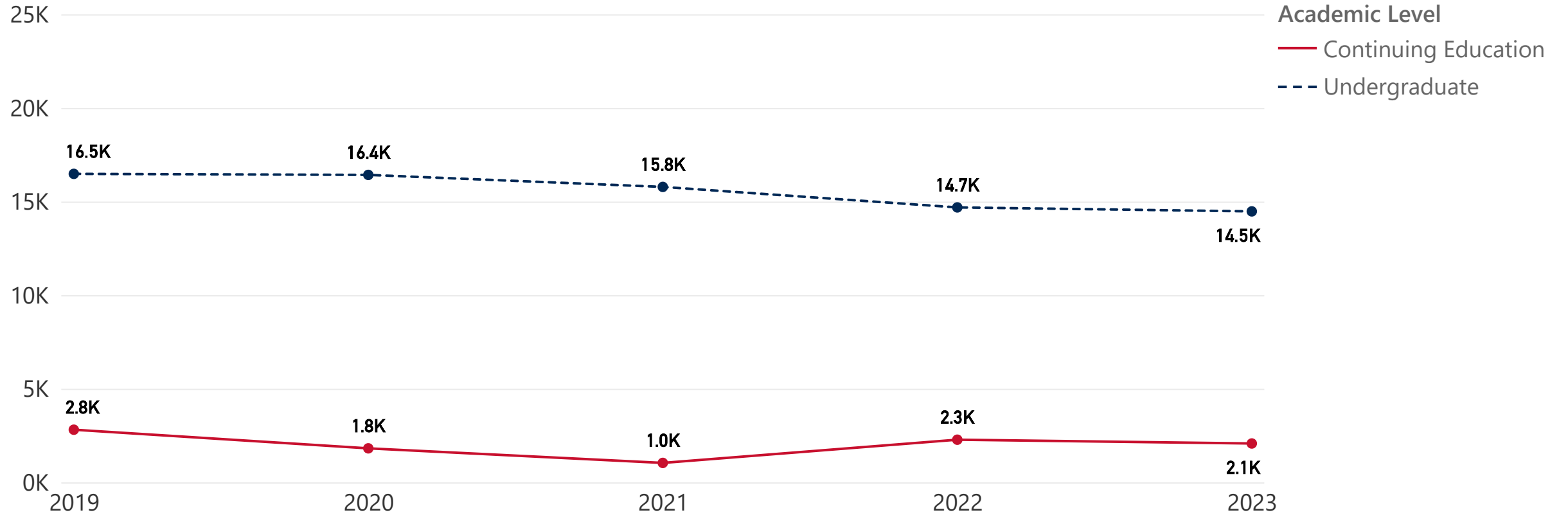

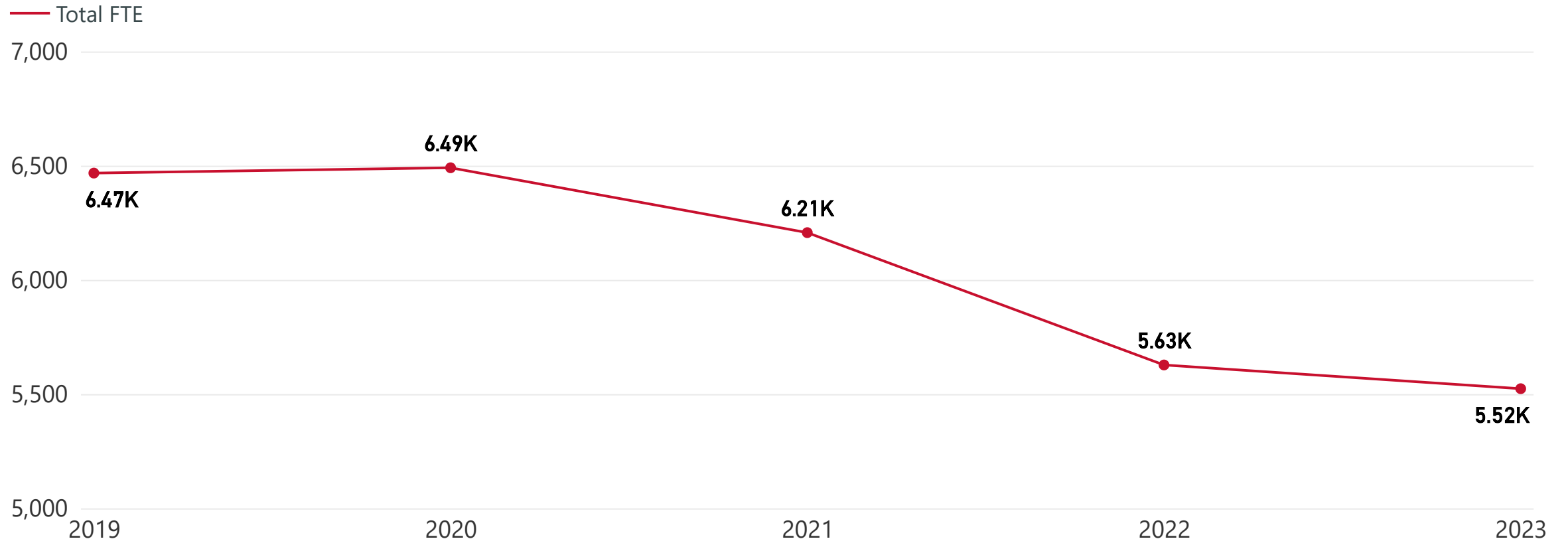

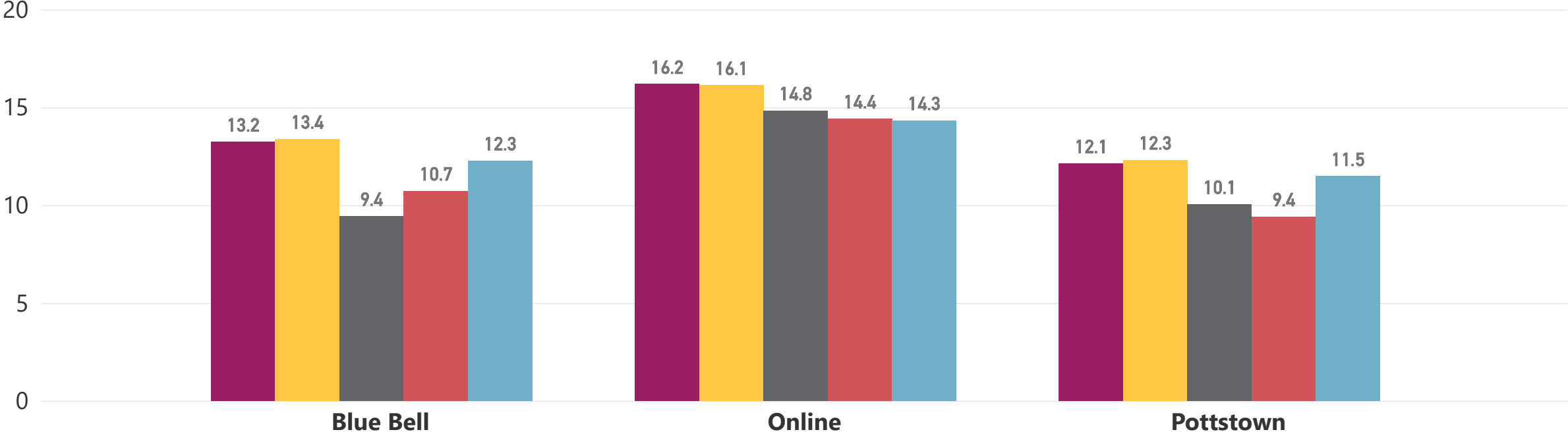

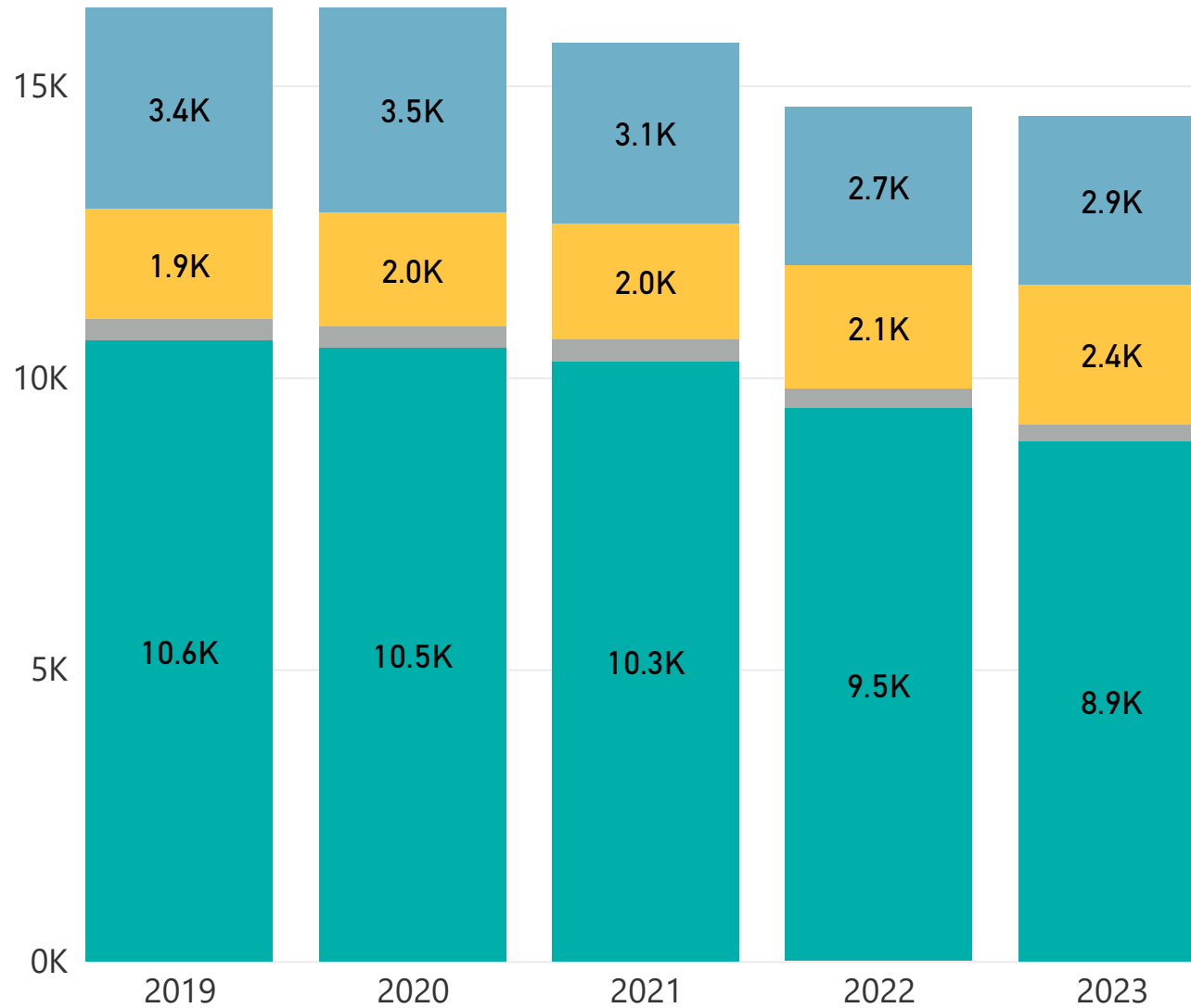

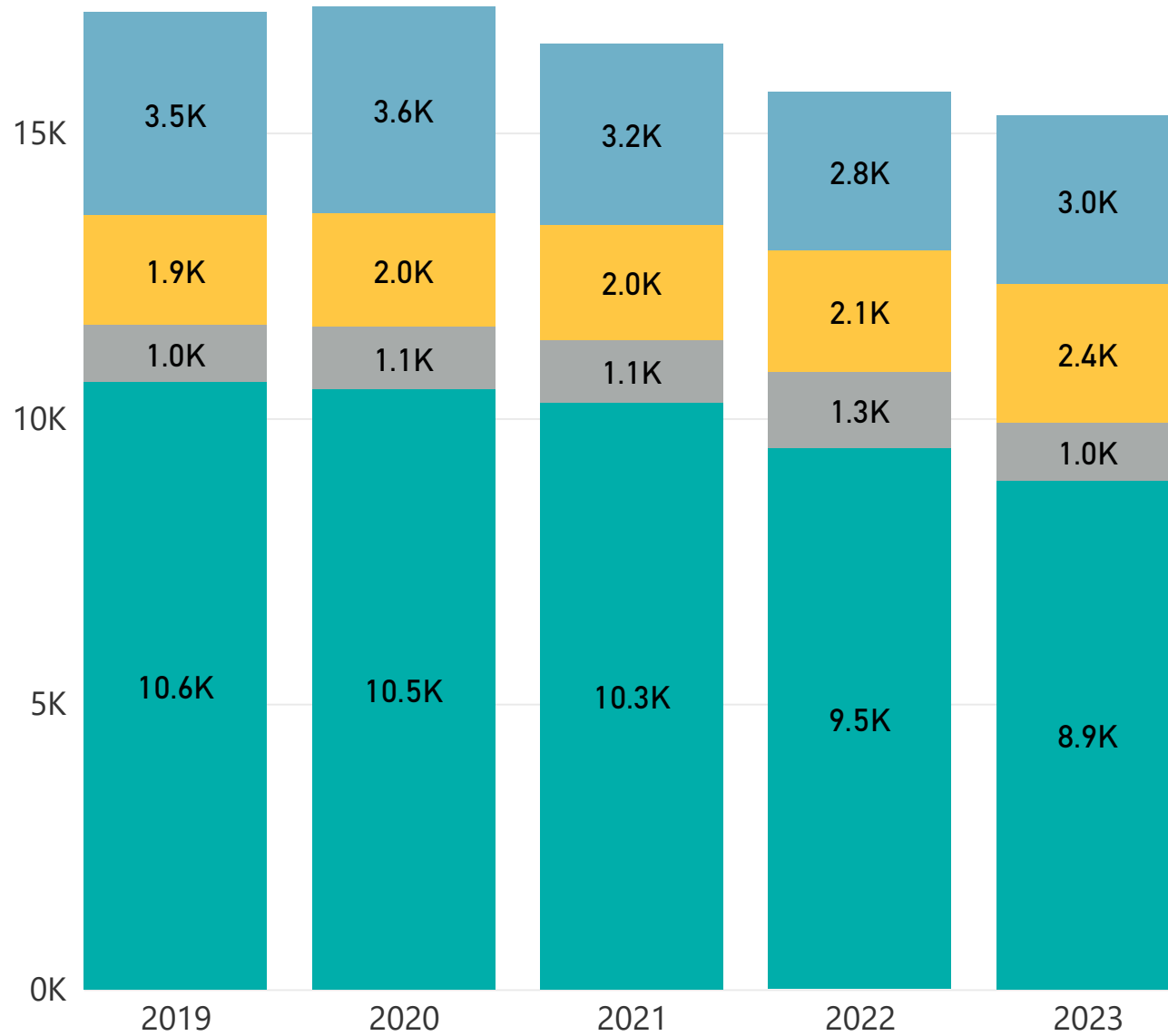

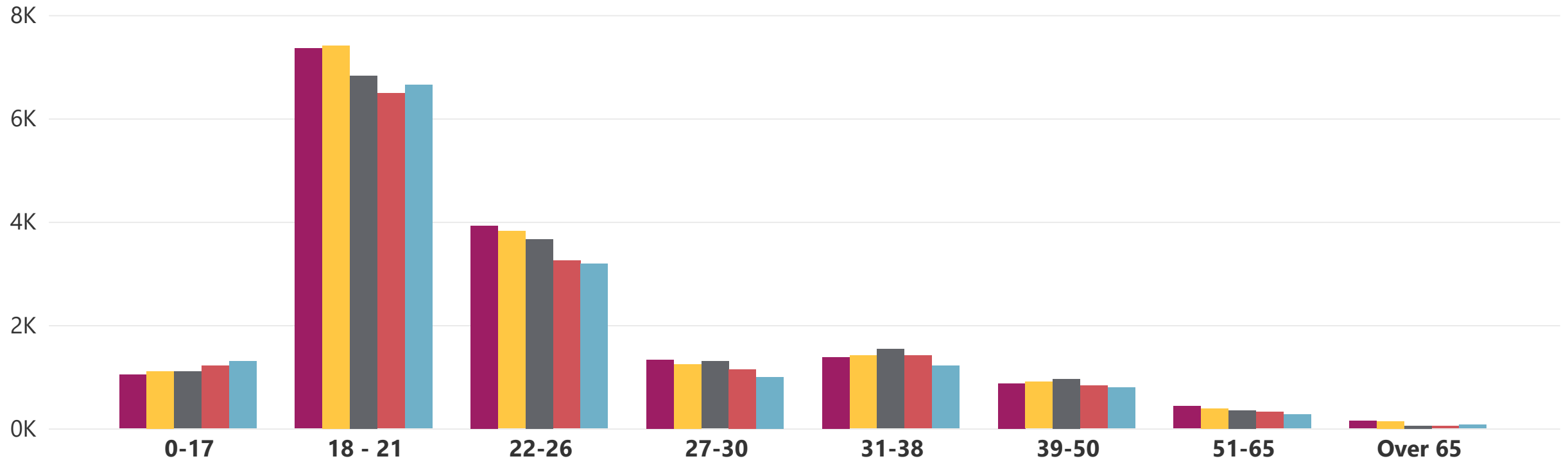

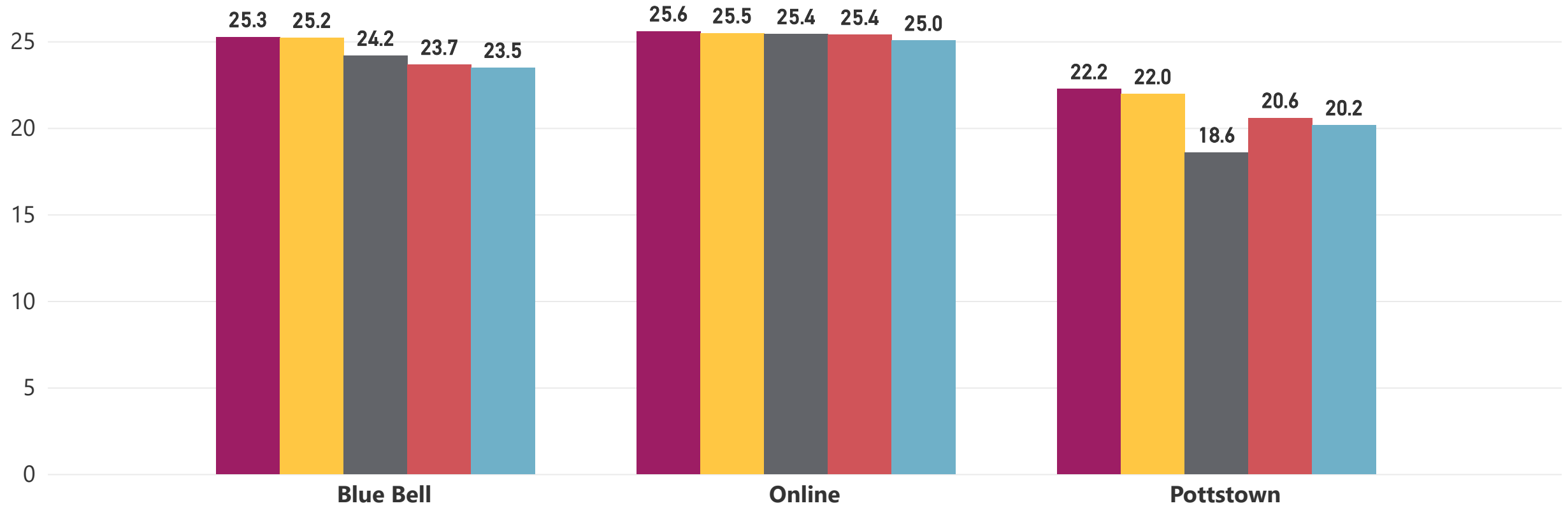

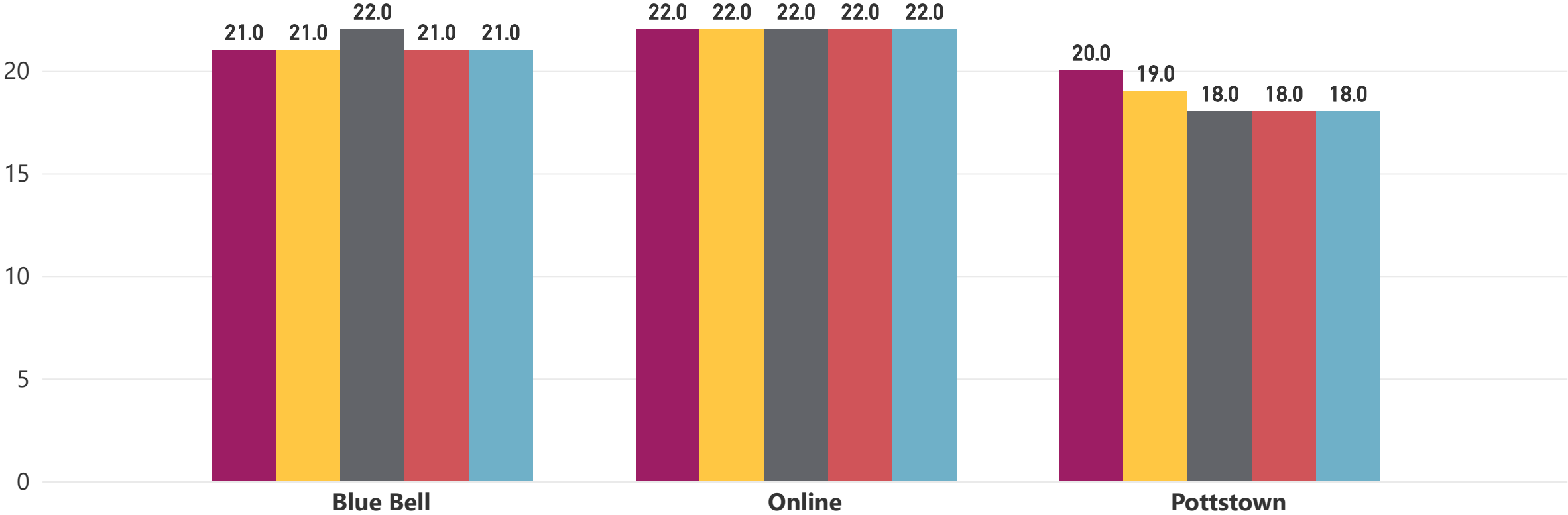

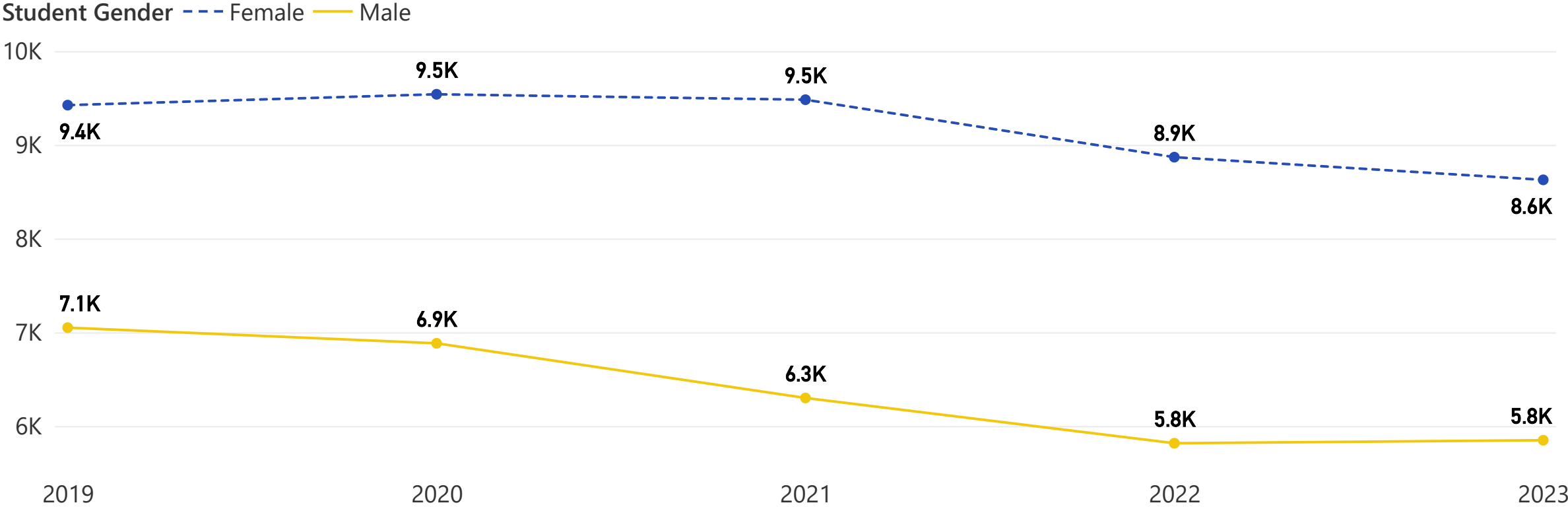

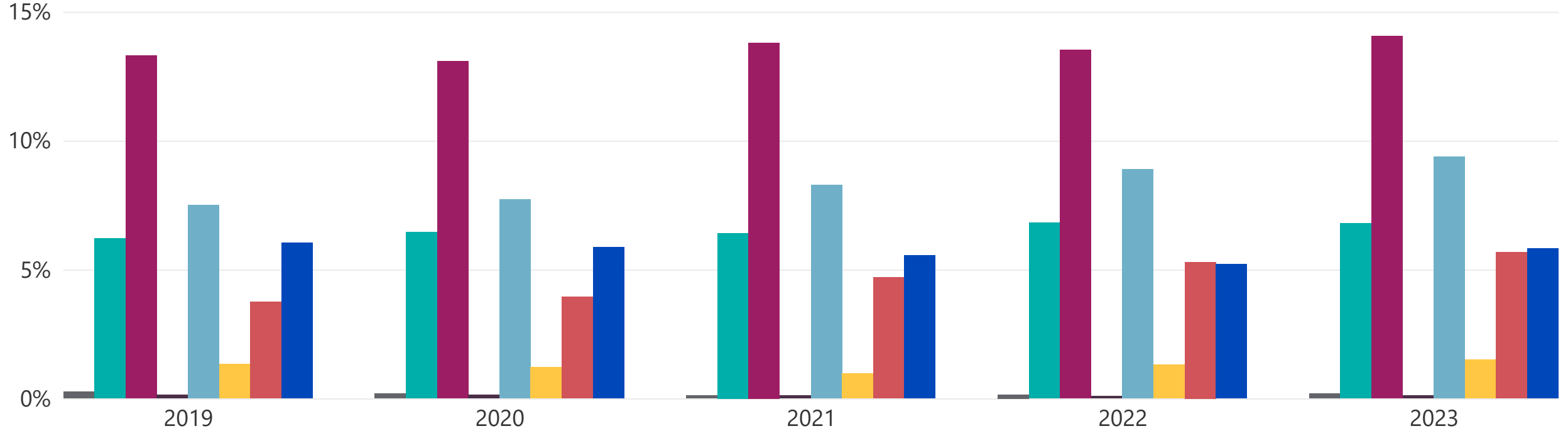

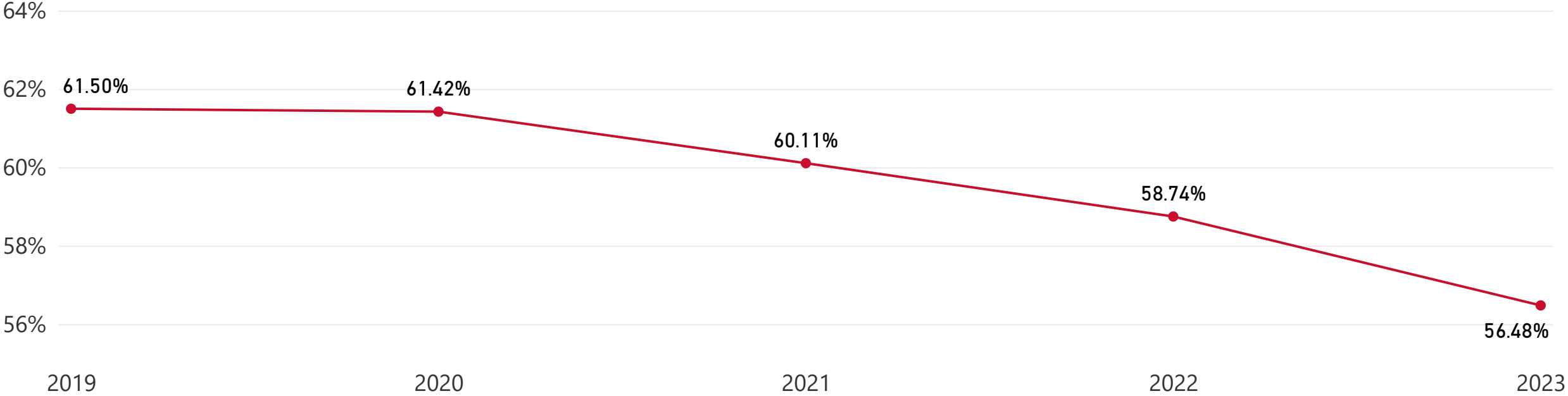

## Dual Enrollment Students

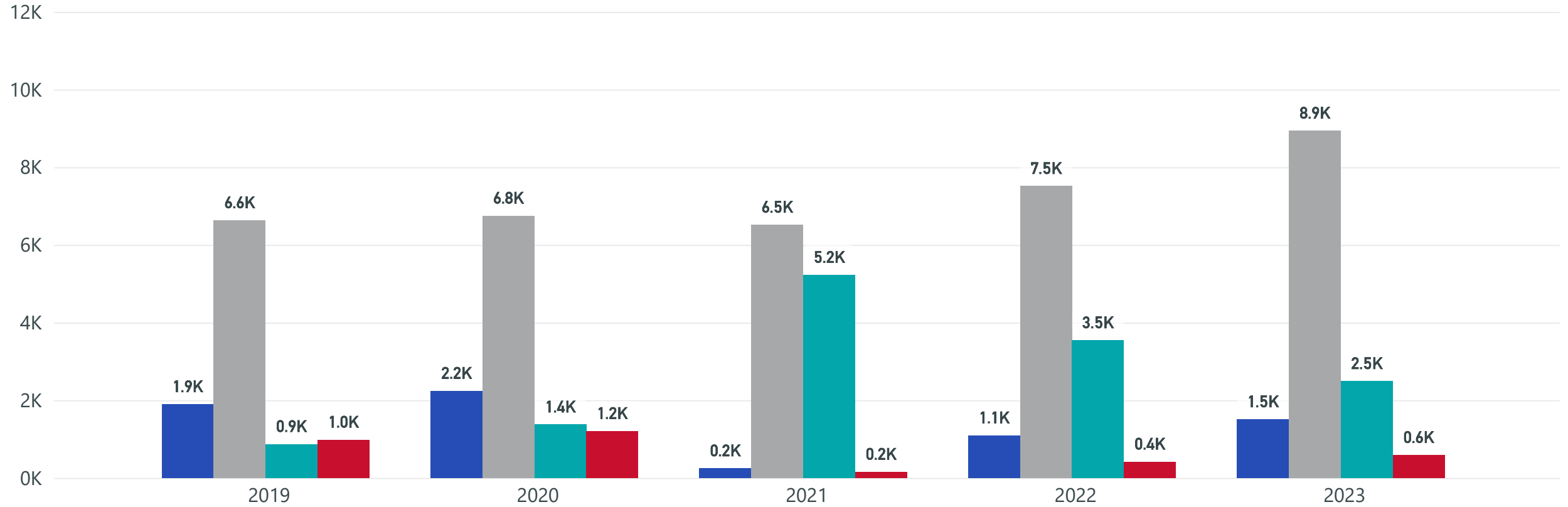

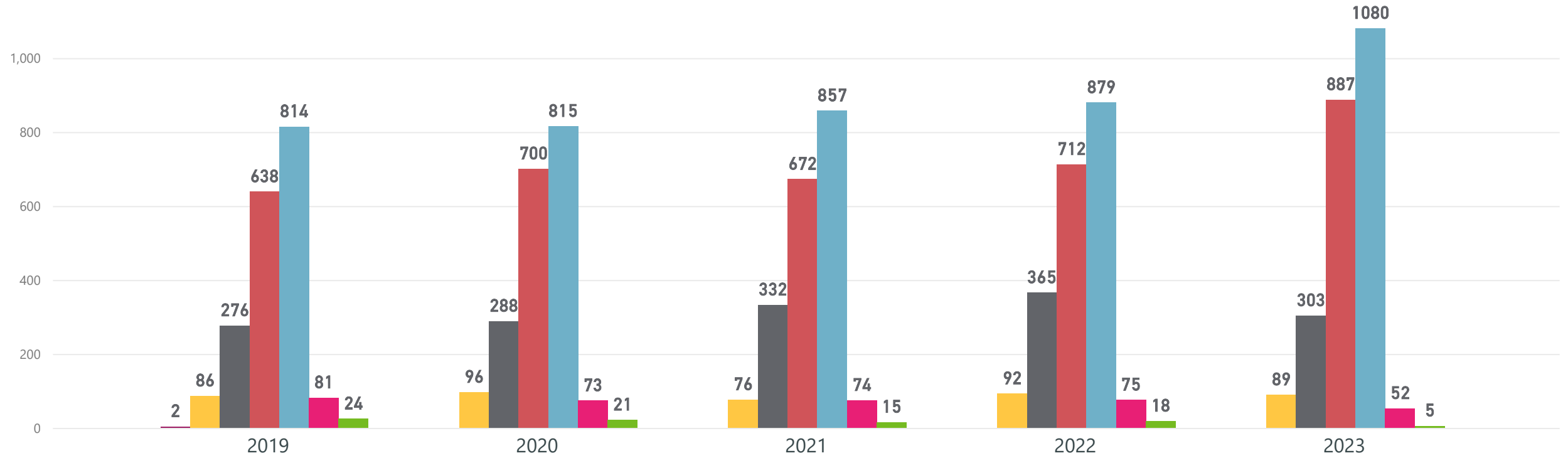

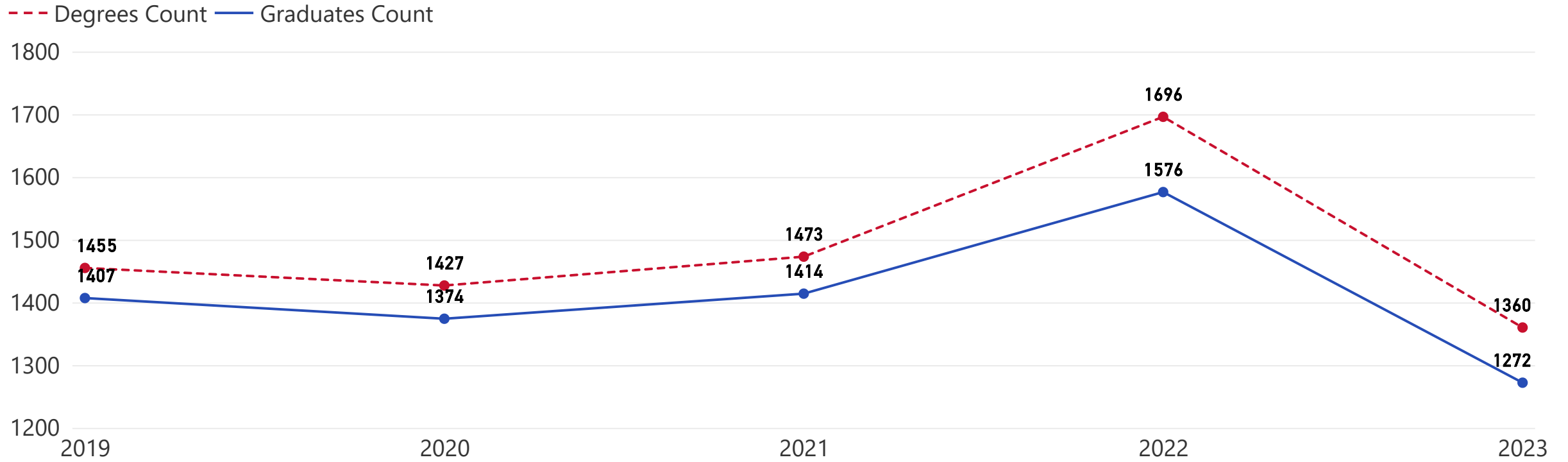

Student success metrics provide data sets that assist the College in identifying critical milestones such as course, certificate, and degree completion. These metrics can be used to guide retention and student success initiatives.

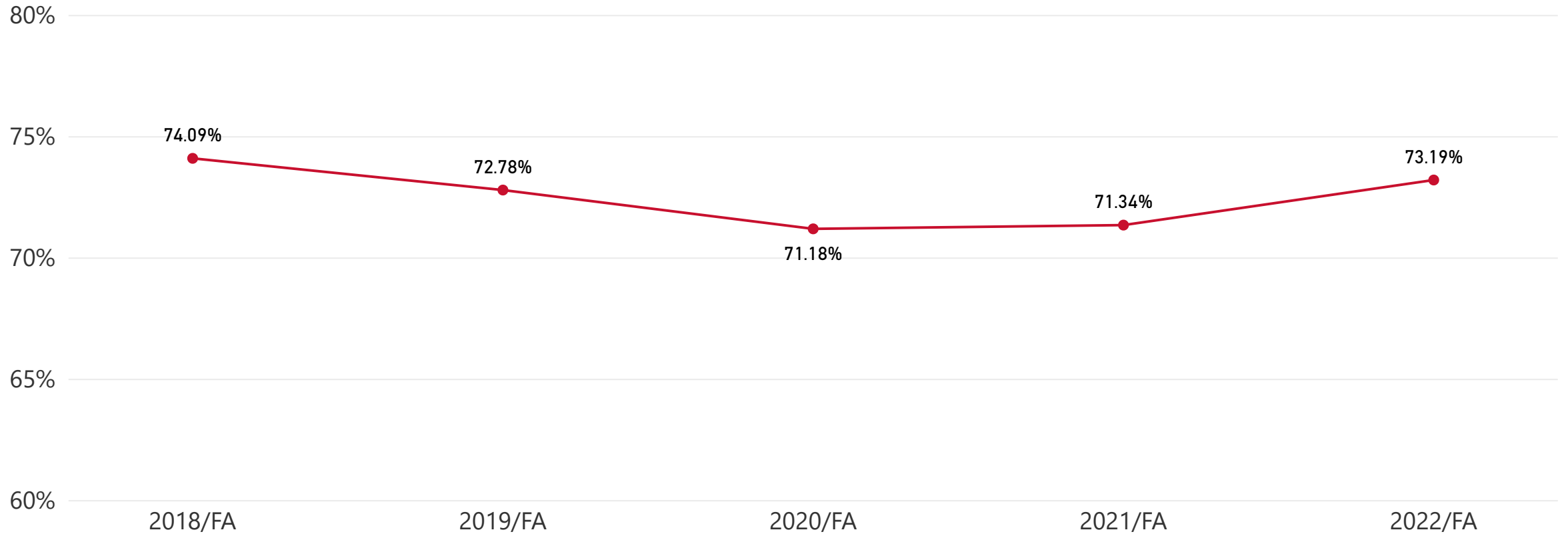

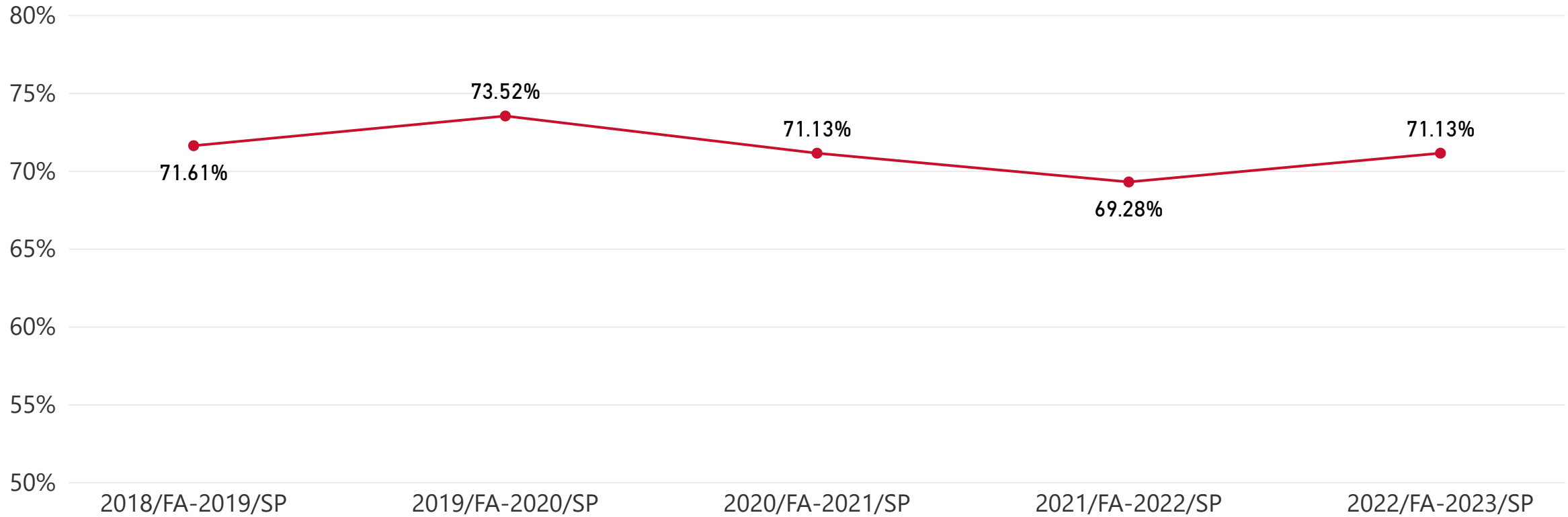

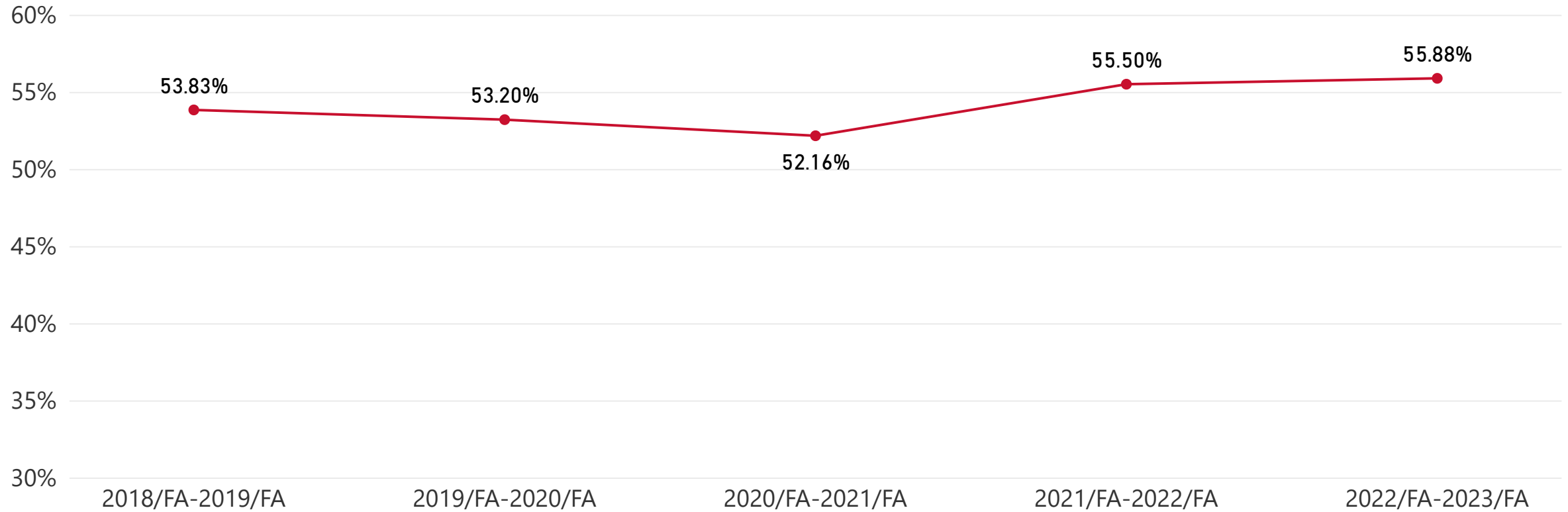
